The Company is an umbrella-structured open-ended investment company organised as a société anonyme under the laws of Luxembourg and qualifies as a SICAV.</li> <li>• The investment objective of the Fund is to generate long term capital appreciation for investors.</li> <li>• Distributions (if any) may be declared at the Company's absolute discretion out of income, capital gains and/or capital, and may have the effect of lowering the Fund's NAV. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● The Fund invests primarily in RMB denominated bonds ((both onshore RMB (CNY) and offshore RMB (CNH)), money market instruments, certificates of deposits, term deposits, credit linked bonds and convertibles. Investments in onshore RMB (CNY) bonds may include bonds traded in both the China interbank bond market and PRC Stock Exchanges and will be made through the Investment Manager’s QFII and/or RQFII quota or any other available channel.</li> <li>● The Fund's investments may also include, but are not limited to, USD denominated bonds, credit linked notes, currency forwards and cross currency swaps.</li> <li>● The Investment Manager intends to adopt a combination of top-down macro research for duration or interest rate management and sector allocation, and bottom-up analysis for credit selection and yield curve positioning.</li> <li>● The Fund may use FDIs as part of the investment strategy, in addition to efficient portfolio management and hedging purposes.</li> </ul>	<p>Refer to paragraph 3 on page [12] of the Singapore Prospectus for further information on the investment strategy of the product.</p>

<p><b>HOW OFTEN ARE VALUATIONS AVAILABLE?</b></p> <p>The Fund is valued on each Dealing Day. The price per Share of all Share Classes is quoted on a forward-pricing basis, and is normally available on the website <a href="http://www.fullertonfund.com">http://www.fullertonfund.com</a> within two (2) Business Days of the actual transaction dates and may also be available on Bloomberg and SIX Telekurs. You may also request for the indicative price per Share from the Singapore Representative (where not available as stated above). To counter dilution and protect investors' interest, the Fund may apply a technique known as swing pricing or dilution adjustment of up to 2% of the NAV as part of its valuation policy.</p> <p><b>HOW CAN YOU EXIT FROM THIS INVESTMENT AND WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND COSTS IN DOING SO?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You can redeem your Shares on any Dealing Day by submitting a written redemption request through the Singapore Representative's approved distributors or other appointed agents.</li> <li>Redemption proceeds are normally paid in the currency of the relevant Share Class within five (5) Business Days from the Dealing Day on which the redemption request is received and processed by the Administrator.</li> <li>Your redemption price is determined as follows:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If you submit your redemption request by 5pm Singapore time on a Dealing Day, you will be paid a price based on the NAV per Share determined on that Dealing Day.</li> <li>If you submit your redemption request after 5pm Singapore time on a Dealing Day your request shall be treated as having been received on the next Dealing Day.</li> <li>Redemption requests sent to approved distributors may be subject to an earlier dealing cut-off time. 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**APPENDIX: GLOSSARY OF TERMS**

<b>ABS / MBS</b>	Debt securities based on a pool of assets or collateralised by the cash flows from a specific pool of underlying assets.
<b>Acc</b>	Accumulation Shares, shares which accumulate their income so that the income is included in the price of the shares.
<b>CNH</b>	Offshore RMB.
<b>CNY</b>	Onshore RMB.
<b>Business Day</b>	A week day on which banks are normally open for business in China, Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, Luxembourg and Singapore.
<b>Dealing Day</b>	A Business Day which does not fall within a period of suspension of calculation of the NAV per Share of the Fund and such other day as the directors of the Company may decide from time to time.
<b>Dist</b>	Distribution Shares, shares which distribute their income.
<b>Emerging and less developed markets</b>	Countries with emerging and less developed markets include, but are not limited to (1) countries that have an emerging stock market in a developing economy as defined by the International Finance Corporation, (2) countries that have low or middle income economies according to the World Bank, and (3) countries listed in World Bank publication as developing.
<b>EU</b>	European Union.
<b>FDIs</b>	Financial derivative instruments, which may include but is not limited to options on securities, over-the-counter options, interest rate swaps, cross currency swaps, credit default swaps, futures, currency forwards, contract for difference, credit derivatives or structured notes such as credit-linked notes and equity-linked notes.
<b>NAV</b>	Net asset value as determined in accordance with the Singapore Prospectus.
<b>over-the-counter (OTC)</b>	Securities traded in some context other than on a formal exchange, such as a dealer network.
<b>P-Notes</b>	Participatory notes, which entitle the holder to certain cash payments, calculated by reference to the underlying equity securities to which the instrument is linked.
<b>PRC</b>	The People's Republic of China (excluding the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, Macau Special Administrative Region and Taiwan).
<b>PRC Stock Exchanges</b>	The Shanghai Stock Exchange, the Shenzhen Stock Exchange and any other stock exchange that may open in the PRC in the future.
<b>QFII</b>	A Qualified Foreign Institutional Investor, as prescribed under the prevailing regulations in the PRC.
<b>QFII Eligible Securities</b>	The securities and investments permitted to be held or made by QFII under the laws and regulations governing the establishment and the operation of the QFII regime in the PRC.
<b>RQFII</b>	A Renminbi Qualified Foreign Institutional Investor under the laws and regulations governing the establishment and operation of the RQFII regime in the PRC.
<b>RQFII Eligible Securities</b>	The securities and investments permitted to be held or made by a RQFII under the laws and regulations governing the establishment and operation of the RQFII regime in the PRC.
<b>RMB</b>	Renminbi, the official currency of the People's Republic of China, is used to denote the Chinese currency traded in the onshore and the offshore markets (primarily in Hong Kong SAR) - to be read as a reference to onshore Renminbi (CNY) and/or offshore Renminbi (CNH) as the context

	requires. For clarification purposes, all references to RMB in the name of a Share Class or in the reference currency must be understood as a reference to offshore RMB (CNH).	
<b>Shares</b>	Shares in the Fund.	
<b>Share Class</b>	Class of Shares in the Fund.	
<b>SICAV</b>	Société d'Investissement à Capital Variable, being an investment company with variable capital that is established in the Grand-Duchy of Luxembourg. The Fullerton Lux Funds qualifies as a SICAV under Part I of the Luxembourg law of 2010 Law relating to undertakings of collective investment.
